KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

You have the right to take a marked sample ballot (like this document) in hand or on a cell phone into the voting booth to use as a reference.

If any problem arises, you have the right to vote with a provisional ballot.

If you have a disability or difficulty reading the ballot, you have the right to receive assistance from a family member, friend, or poll worker.

In the General Election, you may vote for any candidate of your choice, regardless of their political party.
